1. Call to Order

2. Review / Approval of Minutes

3. Update on Statement of Student Rights and Responsibilities

Erik Wessel, Director of the Office of Student Conflict Resolution, informed the committee that President Mark Schlissel approved all of the committee's proposals, two with modifications to the Statement of Student Rights and Responsibilities. The two proposals that had suggested modifications were Proposal 5 – Medical Amnesty and Proposal 7 – Investigation Language.

4. Presentation on Supporting International Graduate Students

Judith Pennywell, Director of the International Center (IC), discussed the demographics of the international student population and the services the IC provides to international graduate students, which include advising and compliance, orientation workshops focusing

on topics such as learning the US, University and Ann Arbor, finding a job on campus, sexual misconduct awareness, cultural differences in the classroom, etc.

Angelo Pittilo, Director of the English Language Institute, provided background information about ELI and detailed its mission. He also described the types of services that ELI provides graduate students, such as summer intensive language programs, online courses for ensuring graduate success, and co-curricular resources.

Deb Meizlish, Managing Director for Educational Development and Assessment Services at the Center for Research on Learning and Teaching, outlined the resources that CRLT provides to graduate students and GSIs, such as teaching orientations and Preparing Future Faculty seminars.
