- I. Welcome to new and previous committee members (Kate standing in for Francine)

- III. Guest: 3:20-3:55pm: Dr. Gail Hohner (Director, Multidisciplinary Design Program, UM-College of Engineering):
  - a. Powerpoint attached
  - b. Dr. Hohner explained the status of students and visiting research with regard to intellectual property. A summary follows:
    - For all university employess (anyone who is paid by UM), including staff, graduate students, faculty, post-docs, etc. The University owns all intellectual property.
    - ii. Anyone else, including non-paid volunteers, part-time students or students working for credit, visiting scholars, and anyone not paid directly by UM, owns their own intellectual property.
    - iii. This means that students can legally patent or publish their results independently. This could effectively shut down the lab.
    - iv. The reason for requiring students to sign over their IP is to protect the investigator and the university.
    - v. There is no absolute requirement for asking students to sign. However, it is a wise protection for the PI, and students can be required to sign as a requirement for employment.
    - vi. Investigators should not offer legal advice, but can explain the meaning of the document.
  - c. Dr. Hohner provided and explained the non-disclosure/IP assignment form. The form itself and an annotated version are attached.
  - d. The student form does not need to be countersigned by the regents.
  - e. Discussion followed with clarification of a few points. Questions could be directed to Gail or to David Grimm (Associated General Counsel)
