The agenda was approved. The minutes for the November meeting were approved.

10:03am-10:19am: Sally Churchill's report with questions and input from SAC

<u>Summary</u>: President Ono's Strategic Visioning plan was discussed. It is set to be a yearlong process spearheaded by three Executive Vice Presidents. The goal is to have this completed ideally by end of calendar year.

Campus land use optimization will be formally reviewed. Among the topics being reviewed is looking at design standards for buildings. This is expected to be a yearlong process.

The major student housing project set to be located at the current Elbel field and adjoining fields will be unveiled at the next Regent's meeting.

Work continues in setting up the Office of Ethics, Integrity, and Compliance (OEIC). A position description for the director of this office is ideally to be ready for the March Regent's meeting.

A question was asked regarding the issue of parking on the medical campus. This is in response to the additional employees set to be hired (1k-2k). This is a complicated and long-standing issue. This is being discussed by the Regents and health system leadership.

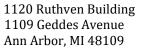
Action: Presentation and Discussion
