Committee Actions

This year we were involved in the transition between an outgoing VP for Communications and someone experienced in that role. One of our committee members served on the search committee for the new VP and provided updates.

Most of the action of the committee was in advising the VP for Communications and their staff. Topics for communication included:

- Communication from new leadership including the President and Provost.
- Messages surrounding the GEO labor actions.
- Strategies for crisis communication.
- Broadening the perceived audience of the office to include a remit for internal communication.

Recommendations

- Determine a way to streamline communication on campus and reduce email clutter.

- Work with the new Vice President of Communications, Richie Hunter, and establish a collaborative relationship between her and the faculty.
